## Impact

High quality support from members of staff funded by Pupil Premium enabled learners to make good progress, particularly in Reading. 100\% of pupils from this group met the expected standard for the Y1 Phonics Screening Check. The school recognises that a higher percentage of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium need to meet the expected standard in Writing and Maths. By the end of Key Stage 2, pupils eligible for Pupil Premium met the expected standard in Reading and Writing.

## Barriers

Attendance for this group had an impact on attainment. $38 \%$ were considered persistently absent (attendance below 90\%) during 2015-2016 academic year. The school recognises that there were often many complex reasons for each absence. For 2016-2017, attention must be given to reduce the number of persistent absenteeism. The school will continue to positively promote good attendance and work closely with parents and families on improving attendance.

## Review planned by Governors

In December 2016, Governors will review the impact of Pupil Premium spending.
