## Impact

By the end of KS2, in maths, the attainment for this group was broadly in line with National data for expected standard and greater depth, whilst in reading and writing, attainment was somewhat below National. However, the number of children in this group was very low, meaning that the statistical significance of the data is affected and the results for each child represent a very large percentage of the overall result.

Again, in KS1, the number of children receiving pupil premium support was very small, which results in difficulty establishing the statistical significance of the results.

In the Phonics Screening Check, 50% of children receiving Pupil Premium support achieved the required standard.

Across Key Stage 2, there were 13 eligible children (six of whom were also on the school's Additional Needs List). In Reading and writing, 6 of the children had reached nationally expected standards by the end of the year, with 7 children still working towards that standard. In Maths, 1 child was judged to have reached a 'Good' standard (i.e. above national expected), with 6 children reaching national standard, and the remaining 6 working towards the standard.

## **Barriers:**

The school recognises that parental involvement can have a direct impact on a child's progress, as can other family factors outside the control of the school. Staff have endeavoured to work with parents and children to ensure they are supported as far as possible and have ensured that parents have been kept fully informed of the progress of the children.

## **Review**

The Governors reviewed the achievements of children eligible for Pupil Premium Funding in October 2019, and they will continue to do this through the Governors Standards Committee, as well as at Full Governing Body Meetings throughout the current academic year. The next time this should be reviewed is in January 2020.

The Governor responsible for overseeing provision for children eligible for Pupil Premium Funding is Mr Richard Atterby.
